





Case study: St. Helens transformed through landscape fund

A large area of the borough's natural environment has been transformed as a result of the St. Helens Landscape Fund.

The Fund was a Section 106 contribution of £210,000 provided by United Utilities as a result of the construction of the West-East Pipeline, which runs between Prescot and Bury. The fund has been managed by The Mersey Forest in partnership with St. Helens Council, St. Helens Chamber and United Utilities.

A wide variety of green projects, from schools to golf courses have benefited from this funding, leading to natural improvements covering an area of 140 hectares of land. Projects have ranged from tree planting to woodland management to the creation of school gardens.
